



In March, Executive Director, Ang Braun, attended the Shockproofing Communities Summit hosted by Women's Shelters Canada and the Canadian Women's Foundation in Ottawa.

The goal of the summit was to share learnings and experiences related to the pandemic with shelters across Canada in hopes of creating a better prepared system if such a crisis were to occur again. 500 delegates from shelters across Canada attended the two day Summit.

100 delegates remained an additional day to meet with Canadian MP's about the 10 year Canadian National Action Plan on Gender Based Violence. The key message that Ang was able to deliver to MP of Provencher, Ted Falk, was that it should not matter where in Canada you live, everyone should have equal access to protection and supports when experiencing gender based violence. The National Action Plan must be seen as Non Partisan and survive election cycles in order for it to have the impact intended.



Residential Program Update

This quarter, the shelter has remained near capacity. Our program manager has joined the Rural Manitoba Sexual Assault Network for a 1 year term. The RMSAN seeks to bring services to rural communities so that victims won't have to travel to Winnipeg for treatment. Staff have participated numerous trainings over the last 3 months including; Vicarious Trauma and Stress, testing a newly developed screening tool for Economic Abuse and Cultural Awareness Training.

Housing & Outreach Program Update

This year we have offered a variety of new programs such as; When Love Hurts (*Phase 1 & 2*) and Rent Smart. We received 32 referrals for women and children experiencing homelessness in our catchment area in the last year, bringing the total to 93 women in the 3 years of programming. The H&O Counsellor continues to provide individual counselling, group counselling, and advocacy supports to women entering this program.

Mens Program Update

We are sorry to announce that we have discontinued the Men's Intervention Program at this time. The Men's program was funded through community donations and the difficult decision was made to end it March 31, 2023. We thank George for his tremendous work on the project.
